## President's Message

Dear Friends,

The year gone by has been one of celebrations! It was our golden jubilee year, a hallmark for any institution that has stood tall amidst the onslaught of economic upheavals and global competition. It was also a celebration of bonhomie, camaraderie, intense engagement with all stakeholders especially our members and the OEMs. The year culminated with a grand finale where we felicitated our leaders and customers. 1 am extremely proud that the membership gave me an opportunity to lead the industry and serve them at a time when the industry hit the point-of-inflection for surging growth.

Industry performance \& outlook: As I look back, 1 am gladdened that the year gone by has also been one of good tidings, growth, hope and optimism. Firstly we were caught unawares with the unprecedented growth in the auto sector. No one expected the recovery to be so quick, so steep and this put the auto industry on an accelerated drive. The passenger vehicles segment grew twenty-eight percent to cross 2.3 million units, the commercial vehicles grew thirty-six percent to breach 0.5 million mark while the two-wheelers market exceeded 10.5 million units in sales growing twenty five percent. 1 am glad that the auto components industry, in tandem with the finished auto goods market, grew to a healthy over USD 21 billion in turnover, while the exports crossed USD 3.2 billion. The first quarter of 2010-11 witnessed significant growth of over thirty percent and this quantum seems to suggest that the growth in the auto component industry this fiscal will surpass twenty percent.

Catalyzing growth \& development: Nothing can be more satisfying for a President than the vibrancy of the forum he leads and I am delighted that the last year outshone all previous ones on account of the number of activities ever held in a single year.

Technological development and moving up the value-chain were given a special thrust in the year 2009-10. We signed an MoU with the Fraunhofer Institute, Germany to carry forward joint initiatives and technology development in India along with our partners SIAM and NATRiP. ACMA CEOs' Mission to Israel gave us an insight into how innovation and new product development is carried out in one of the most advanced and technology savvy nations. An engagement with the Technion University, Israel to create an innovation environment within the auto component industry is also on the anvil. Further, our initiative with MIT, USA continues.

During the year ACMA continued to be in the forefront of industry development. Trade missions organised to Thailand and Brazil were instrumental in carrying forward the ACMA agenda of promoting strategic tie-ups in these growing markets. To enhance business opportunities for ACMA membership and to promote technology acquisitions in Europe, a special two-day B2B partnership event - 'India Europe Automotive Suppliers Meet' was organised in Bangalore. Exports received a special thrust through ACMA group participation at key international auto shows like IAA, Frankfurt; Iran International Auto Parts Fair, Iran and BSM in Brazil. Auto Expo, our flagship event was jointly organised along with Cll and SIAM. With over two thousand companies displaying and close to a hundred international business delegations, Auto Expo broke all-previous records in terms of response from the stakeholders.

ACMA Center for Technology (ACT) continued to spearhead the drive for quality, productivity and technology for ACMA members. An ACT Cluster programme and an Advanced Cluster programme were launched in Pune. Further, to handhold the SME sector, two dedicated SME cluster programmes were launched one each in Bangalore and Jamshedpur. Another foundation cluster programme was also launched in Jamshedpur. In its pursuit of promoting innovation, a New Product Development Cluster, with no geographical boundaries, and another cluster on Engineering have also been announced.

The Young Business Leaders' Forum (YBLF), our response to address the challenges of mentoring the next generation was restructured to allow for faster induction of new blood and to ensure quicker churn of leadership at the top. The new YBLF continued its exciting journey with interactions with several luminary thought leaders as also global OEMs. The young brigade's mission to Turkey enriched them with an exposure to management and technology excellence in the Turkish auto sector.

New initiatives: 1 am also pleased that the year gone by has been one of new initiatives, introspection and rethinking. To streamline the deliverables from the ACMA stable, for the first time Terms-of-Reference (ToRs) were defined for all committees and an Annual Integrated Calendar of ACMA activities announced. I am happy that the Chairpersons of our committees and the Executive Committee members engaged with enhanced responsibility and accountability for better delivery of services to our stakeholders throughout the year.

ACMA's outreach to international domain scaled new heights; its horizons broadened to look beyond the conventional auto sector into aerospace, defense \& railways. New initiatives have been launched on skill development and I am pleased to mention that the government has formally announced the setting up of the Auto Skill Development Council (ASDC). Sustainable development with emphasis on monitoring carbon footprint in the auto component sector was another new initiative that was received with much enthusiasm.

To serve the industry in tune with its evolving needs and to be globally competitive, we commissioned Ernst \& Young (E\&Y) as our Knowledge Partner to keep us abreast with the global business trends and also map the business \& policy environment in India and overseas. With changes in the business environment, E\&Y is now engaged in recalibrating the deliverables of the AMP as also delineating the Vision 2020 for the auto component industry. As per the estimates, the industry may well be five-folds of its current size by 2020. This Vision document will be the basis for all future reference and policy formulation for the auto component sector. Further, to gauge the size of the after-market and the impact of sales of spurious components on the industry and the government's exchequer, a detailed study has been undertaken. I hope these initiatives will be a step forward towards making ACMA the knowledge hub for the auto industry.

Service delivery: As the Indian economy scales newer heights and the per capita income grows beyond the USD 1,000 mark, our industry beckons the ACMA secretariat to transform itself into a world-class institution. With implementation of the restructuring plan of the ACMA secretariat through Deloitte, a consultancy of international repute, the ACMA secretariat is now ready to set a new benchmark in service delivery. A new HR policy has also been put in place to take care of our secretarial staff. We are now in the process of institutionalizing the Council of Past Presidents for incisive guidance to the ACMA Executive Council. The year also witnessed change-of-guards at the ACMA secretariat, Vinnie Mehta took over as our new Executive Director as Vishnu Mathur moved over to SIAM after a glorious stint with us. We also strengthened ACMA infrastructure with a new Zonal office for the Western Region in Pune. Our new office premises in Jamshedpur will be operational shortly.
challenges. In an environment where change is the only constant, we at ACMA had to deal with a myriad of issues. The industry is in the mode of capacity expansion, but with poor infrastructure, insufficient power, lack of skilled manpower and low return on investments, scaling up has been somewhat behind. Further, the onslaught of imports, as the Government liberally signed several FTAs and bilateral trade agreements, made it difficult for the industry. The latter half of the year witnessed the European economy and the Euro hitting troubled waters, thus putting to jeopardy our exports prospects in the region. However, l am confident that ACMA will continue to spearhead the cause and take up these issues with concerned authorities for re-addressal.

Acknowledgements: I must acknowledge the support of the Governments, the centre and the states alike, who have been extremely receptive to ACMA's suggestions and inputs especially with regards to trade, monetary and fiscal policies. ACMA continued to engage proactively with the government on matters of FTA, WTO, technical standards and automotive regulations. My special gratitude to the Ministry of Heavy Industry and Public Enterprises, our nodal ministry, whose unstinted support and guidance we have always cherished. I am hopeful that our dialogue with the government on creating an Auto Component Development Fund will fructify in the near future. I would also like to place on record my appreciation for the support extended to us by CII, SIAM and IMTMA.

As I handover the mantle to the new President, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our members for their support and the trust reposed in me. I would particularly like to thank the Vice President, the Regional, the Committee and the Zonal Chairpersons, the Past Presidents, the Chief Mentor-ACT and our Executive Committee members for their guidance and dynamic involvement. Last but not the least, no action can be realized without the active contribution of the secretariat. My heartfelt thanks to the entire ACMA secretariat.

I am very confident that ACMA and the entire auto component industry will grow from strength-tostrength in the coming years and will play a handsome role in the overall growth of the national economy.

Challenges: While growth is indeed very heartening and welcome, it has its own set of

Mr. Jatender Mehta, Chairman, Aerospace \& Railways and MD, Omax Autos Ltd. This was the first ever delegation of auto component manufacturers in India to HAL. Mr. K. G. Subramony, General Manager (Overhaul Division), Mr. G. S. Gupta, General Manager (Engine Division) Mr. R. Rajan, Senior Manager (PR), Mr. H. S. Nanjundaswamy, Chief Manager-Technical) and other senior officials from HAL joined the interaction. Mr. K. G. ## Seminar on IP Management through Brand Protection, New Delhi

January 7, 2010
A strong IPR strategy and intelligent management of IPRs has potential for far greater value than tangibles'- was the message echoed by President, ACMA, Mr. Jayant Davar; Vice President, ACMA, Mr. Srivats Ram and Chairman, Consumer Affairs and Anti Counterfeiting Committee, Mr. Soumitra Bhattacharya, at the ACMA Seminar on 'IP Management through Brand Protection'. The seminar highlighted the types of IPRs and the basis of protection. Deliberating specifically on the basis of protection of Trade Marks (TMs), Mr. Safir Anand, Senior Advocate, Anand \& Anand, spoke on how the use of TMs could vary from country to country, the circumstances under which one can suit for infringement for a registered TM or a non-registered TM, broad principles of comparison and the importance of TMs in mergers and acquisitions. Mr. V Ravi, Senior Joint Registrar, Trade Marks, in his presentation on the general rules and requirements on TMs spoke on the exclusive rights to use the mark in relation to goods and services. Mr. Ravi talked on how the rights to use a trademark were superior to the rights acquired by registration.

In his presentation on some of the FAQs on Copyrights, Mr. G R Raghavendra, Registrar of Copyrights, deliberated on copyright infringement and enforcement of copyright through civil, criminal and administrative remedies. Mr. K R Bhargava, Chief Commissioner, Customs highlighted the obligations under IPR laws, IPR enforcement rules with regard to import of goods suspected to be infringing IPRs and the issues and concerns for effective implementation. Besides participation from ACMA member companies, the seminar also had representation from OEMs including Ford, Honda Motors, Greaves Cotton and GM.

## Economic Affairs, WTO \& Knowledge Partner Committee

ACMA continued to proactively work with the Government of India during the year. A number of discussions with various Ministries and Departments of Government of India were held. Steps taken by the government during the period of economic slowdown helped revive the domestic automotive industry and the auto component industry.

## Ministry of Heavy Industries and Public Enterprises

## Seminar on New Technologies in Plastics in the Automotive Industry, Pune

July 28, 2009
New age engineering plastics besides an aesthetic appeal are also exhibiting superior mechanical and thermal properties for various automotive applications. ACMA organised national seminar on 'New Technologies in Plastics for the Automotive Industry'. Welcoming speakers and participants of the event, Mr. Jatender Mehta, Chairman-Raw Material Committee, ACMA and MD, Omax Autos Ltd., said that application of plastics was continuously increasing in an attempt to reduce weight of vehicles and make them fuel efficient. He highlighted some new technologies that had evolved to reduce engine noise and promote high temperature thermoplastics for engine compartments. Giving an overview of typical polymer applications in passenger cars and more specifically in VW models Dr Sanjay Arole, DGM (QA- Laboratory), Volkswagen India Pvt Ltd, spoke on some of the practical aberrations in polymer processing and steps to avoid them. Dr Arole illustrated some of the test methods used by VW to evaluate pre-damage of the material and also the procedures and requirements to evaluate emissions. Presentation by Reliance highlighted the New Generation Polypropylene Composites for the automotive industry. The presentation highlighted Long Fibre reinforced thermoplastics and oriented polyolefin Composites.

Hydro S \& S gave an overview of modified polypropylene compounds with high impact resistant grades of plastics for body panels. The speaker also informed participants on the advantages of thermoplastic elastomer part production. BASF has developed
tools for metal to plastic conversions. Their integration simulation tools can predict part behaviour through crash simulation, part testing, structural analysis, and processing analysis. Presentation by SABIC focussed on use of polycarbonate resins for light weight glazing , low density foams for headliners and the thermoplastic portfolio that covers the basic assembly for automotive forward lighting. Speakers at the seminar included Dr Sanjay Arole, DGM, (QA- Laboratory), Volkswagen India Pvt Ltd, Pune; Mr. Bhaskar Ghosh, Senior Vice President, Reliance Industries Ltd, Mumbai; Mr. N K Ramaswamy, Chief Executive Hydro S \& S Ltd, Chennai; Mr. Rohit Roop Ghosh, Manager, Engg Plastics (Asia Pacific), BASF, Singapore and Mr. Sanjeev Dwivedi, Senior Key Account leader (Automotive), SABIC Innovative Plastics, Gurgaon.

## Skill Development Committee

The AMP Vision document, envisages that the automotive
industry will provide additional employment to 25 million people by 2016. Towards this end, it is envisaged that the auto component industry will create 1 million additional jobs.

An integral part of the creation of the 1 million additional jobs in the auto component sector is the need for "employable persons", with appropriate skill sets, at each level of the supply chain. Keeping in view the new set of challenges that the auto component segment is facing in a global environment, the workforce requires both an upgradation of existing skills and also acquisition of new set of skill sets, as compared to the past.

Towards this end, coupled with the government's focus and vision and with the formation of the National Skills Development Corporation, ACMA has introduced a new dimension and thought process in the association by forming the National Committee for Skill Development. The ACMA Committee for Skill Development has been focusing on enhancing, supporting and encouraging initiatives for training and skill development, by working with the government, and developing new ideas and opportunities for training.

The Committee has had meetings during the year and visited institutes of repute that provide training in the automotive sector. Visits were organised to institutes such as the Toyota Technical Training Institute (TTTI) and the Bosch Vocational Center (BVC) in Bangalore, Gedee Technical Training Institute (GTTI) in Coimbatore, ITI - Gurgaon adopted by Maruti and the Minda Group's "Pathshala" in Manesar. These experience sharing visits were organised with the objective of understanding both the existing level of training available, the course content, curriculum planning, etc. One of the focus areas has been to work with the Department of Heavy Industry and other stakeholders in the formation of an "Automotive Skills Development Council" (ASDC) at the National Level that would complement the existing vocational education system. The ASDC would help the Indian Automotive Industry in meeting the entire value chain's requirements of appropriately trained manpower in quantity and quality, across all levels, on a sustained and evolving basis. A number of meetings have were with government and other stake holders in this regards.

SME Seminar on Industry Partnership through Joint Ventures, New Delhi
May 14, 2009
SMEs that are looking for growth opportunities, a joint venture could be one of the many possible options. A seminar for CEOs of Small and Medium Enterprises on 'Industry partnerships through Joint Ventures' was organised by ACMA. Mr. Davar advised members to prepare a joint venture format keeping all such things into consideration. Mr. Rattan Kapur, MD, Mark Exhaust Systems Ltd. said that the focus should be on the type and level of technology if it was technological one, whereas a financial joint venture could be completely capital centric. There has to be a complete behavioural transparency with clear visibility of feelings, actions and thoughts, was what Mr. Deepak Jain, Executive Director, Lumax Industries Ltd. felt while expressing his views in the seminar. A company must evaluate, if it was ready for a JV , leaving aside the fear factors involved in terms of losing customers, anger, frustrations or distrust.

Sharing his views on how to make a JV sustainable, Mr. Arvind Kapur, MD, Rico Auto Industries Ltd., emphasised on the role of formulating a Business Plan that needed to be very practical. He advised members not to go in for targets that were difficult to achieve. It

ACMA is working closely with Fraunhofer Institutes on various available options to support R\&D in India.

## One Day Conference on Light Weighting with Fraunhofer, Germany, New Delhi

March 23, 2010
In its pursuit of developing R\&D activities in the automotive industry, ACMA had undertaken a mission to the Fraunhofer Institutes, Germany in September 2009. A Memorandum of Understanding ( MoU ) was signed among Fraunhofer, ACMA, SIAM \& NATRiP, at the conference on "Automotive LightWeighting". The objective of the Conference and signing of MoU was to provide a platform to the automotive industry in India, for new R\&D in various fields of Engineering at a competitive cost. The conference brought awareness to the participants on the need of developing generic "light weighting technologies" to a pre-competitive level, which could be deployed by the vehicle and component manufacturers to reduce weight of the various components and the vehicles they are producing in India. The process of forming up a joint core group consisting of technical heads from ACMA \& SIAM membership has started, which would identify the vehicle and the components for light weighting project and then carry out the research with the active support from Fraunhofer Institute, as a knowledge partner.

## 10 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Auto Expo 2010 January 5-11, 2010

The 10th Auto Expo, the complete automotive show held from 5-11 January, 2010, was organised jointly by ACMA, Cll and SIAM in New Delhi. The Expo, this year surpassed all records set in the earlier auto expos and has grown from strength to strength since 1986, in terms of domestic as well as foreign participation, international delegations, product launches, focused pavilions, orders booked, trade enquiries, business visitors and glamour, to say the least. The global economic downturn notwithstanding, the show saw many new launches than any other previous editions with international firms taking the lead. A total of 25 new models were unveiled and 15 concept vehicles were also at the Auto Expo 2010.

It was spread over 1,25,500 sq.mtrs. which includes 24 permanent halls, 17 hangers and 6 state pavilions. The total number of participants were 2,105 which comprised 1,298 Indian participants and another 807 overseas participants. Exhibitors including small and medium enterprises, from the component industry took up a total of 38,000 square metres of space at the expo venue which is approximately 10 per cent more that the space taken at the last expo.

Over 1,700 component manufacturers and 42 vehicle manufacturers participated in the show. The expo witnessed the largest ever overseas participation with Spain, Taiwan and U.K. Luxembourg was seen first time at the expo.

Around $12,05,152$ visitors of which $10,04,124$ were business delegates thronged the show.

The success of the expo is a testimony to India's emergence as a global manufacturing hub, Union Minister of State for Commerce and Industry Mr. Jyotiraditya Scindia said at the valedictory function of the 10th Auto Expo.

On the culmination of the Silver Jubilee edition of the Auto Expo, several exhibitors were honoured with silver plaques for their various contributions to the show. The awards were given away by Mr. Jyotiraditya Scindia, Minister of State for Commerce \& Industry, Govt. of India.

 June 12, 2009Based on the overwhelming feedback received from the previous programme on SMED \& POKA YOKE held in March 2009, ACMA (NR) organised a training programme on 'POKA YOKE \& SMED'. The focus was to minimise unwanted activities, thus reducing waste of time and product. Mr. Sanjay Malhotra, Regional Council Member (NR), ACMA and MD, Jumps Auto Ltd., mentioned that SMED \& POKA Yoke were the two tools which helped in reducing 'Waste' in organisations by limiting excess Motion, Inventories and Waiting Time. Mr. Manoj Mathur, the faculty, briefed that SMED was a method introduced by 'Shigeo Shingo', 'to reduce setup durations' from hours to minutes. The main goal of SMED was to reduce setup time to less than 10 minutes i.e. single digit. He also illustrated how adopting SMED process led to 'reduction in Inventory, Repair and Scrap' and 'Increase in productive run time' and how SMED could be applied to any department of an Organisation i.e. HR, Production, Inventory. Thus by eliminating MUDAs (wastes) in process, one can significantly reduce lead Time and supply quality product to customers in a more efficient manner. The faculty, Mr. Rakesh Gupta explained the Poka Yoke which is a technique for achieving Zero Defect and is a highly effective way to reduce 'Mistakes' and boost 'Quality'. It is a device which prevents incorrect parts from being made or assembled. Root causes of defects, Error Proofing Techniques and Devices were also discussed at length.

The presentation highlighted the importance of a Digital Economy. Mr. Karthikeyan mentioned that the key Industry Drivers were Globalisation, Cost Reduction, Product Life Cycle and Competition. He explained the concept of Virtual Design and elaborated on the CAD/CAM methodology and Digital Mockup. He described solutions for various stages - Concept, Design prototype, Product release, Change control, Manufacture/ maintenance and service.

## Conference on De-Risking Exports, Chennai

July 24, 2009
To enlighten the membership at large on how some of the companies went about de-risking their exposure in context of exports post global recession, ACMA (SR) organised a Conference on "De-risking Exports". The meeting was attended by the members of the SR and the Executive Committee. Mr. Ashok Taneja, Past-President, ACMA \& MD \& CEO, Shriram Pistons \& Rings Ltd. and Mr. Soumitra Bhattacharya, Senior VP, Bosch Ltd. made presentations from an Indian and Global Company's perspective respectively. A perspective on Finance was presented by Mr. N. Shankar, ED, Export-Import Bank of India. Welcoming the participants, Mr. Srivats Ram, Chairman (SR), ACMA, expressed concern that the past few quarters saw margins from exports erode and unsatisfactory return on investments on capacity creation by the Indian auto component industry.

Setting the theme for the Conference, Mr. Dhiraj Mathur, ED, and Mr. Abdul Majeed, Principal Consultant, PricewaterhouseCoopers Pvt Ltd., mentioned in view of the uncertainity created by the exchange range volatility and the change in automotive landscape in matured markets the focus would see a shift from market share to profitability.

Giving an Export Financiers view, Mr. N. Shankar, ED, ExportImport Bank of India, mentioned the crisis was driven by three key factors, firstly, global recession and financial crisis; secondly, shift to small/basic cars and a move towards more fuel efficient technology and thirdly, due to collapse of truck sales globally compounded by low order bookings driven by frozen credit markets and reduction in trade volumes.

Giving an overview of the Bosch Group, Mr. Soumitra Bhattacharya, Senior VP (Finance \& Administration) Diesel

Systems India, mentioned that India was an important strategic location for the Group.

Presenting his perceptions on De-Risking Exports, Mr. Ashok Taneja, MD \& CEO, Shriram Pistons \& Rings Ltd. mentioned that their company had taken a policy of 60:20:20 for OE, Exports and Aftermarket respectively to help tide over cyclical and external changes to the business environs. He opined that the international markets were highly sophisticated and that the Indian industry was lagging behind especially in technology.

Summing up, Mr. Harish Lakshman, Deputy Chairman, ACMA (Southern Region) thanked all the speakers for their insights and suggestions in managing the risks provided with exports.

ACMA (SR)-ACT-ACMA IT Committee Special ERP event for ACMA SMEs featuring Openbravo, Bangalore
October 28, 2009

The ACMA IT group organised a half day event to introduce OpenbravoERP to the ACMA SMEs. Openbravo's CEO, Mr. Manel Sarasa, and their CTO, Mr. Paolo Juvara, showcased Openbravo's, functionality and suitability. In addition, a demo of Openbravo solution already implemented at an ACMA SME firm in Chennai was carried out. As part of ACMA IT Sub Committee's remit, various ERP systems that suit the needs of the SMEs (Small and Medium Enterprise) amongst Indian auto component manufacturers were identified and studied. One of the systems was Openbravo, a full fledged open source ERP system used by several companies worldwide. The company was ready with BS 111 and IV versions. Plans were also afoot to initiate R\&D activity in the plant.

Welcoming delegates at the Delphi-TVS Diesel Systems facility, Mr. Sudesh Sud mentioned that Small Group Activities was one of the major differentiators in the plant in Uttarakhand. He highlighted the efforts being made to de-skill operations in the pump sub-assembly and on cycle time reduction. Other best practices shared and witnessed during the visit to the shop floor were Kaizens, Poka Yokes and efforts being made for cost reduction and elimination of machine brake down.

Minda Industries Ltd. shared its best practices on TPM. Mr. Bimal Bedi, Plant Head, explained in detail the steps of Jishu Hozen which included 1S, 2S, tagging, machine layout with stage wise machine description, identifying sources of contamination and Kaizens.

At Mahindra \& Mahindra, welcoming the delegation Mr. S.K. Dubey, Vice President and Plant Head (FES), mentioned that the company was world's 1st tractor company to get the Deming Prize and the Japan Quality Medal (JQM). M\&M Farm Equipment Sector (FES) was the market leader with over $43 \%$ of market share. Over $50 \%$ of the total FES business of M\&M was contributed by the Uttarakhand plant. The employee performances were measured in terms of Productivity, Quality, Cost, Delivery, Morale, Safety and CSR.

## Other Programmes

Discussion with the Technical and Further Education (TAFE) mission, Victorian Government, Australia, Chennai September 22, 2009

Technical and Further Education (TAFE) mission (similar to Industrial Training Institutes (ITls) in India) interacted with ACMA. She suggested that the institutes could look at partnering with it is and polytechnics in India as knowledge partners in developing a curriculum customised for Indian industry and also bring in their best practices. This could also be a platform for cross learning, Ms. Sriram opined. Ms. Geeta Heffernan, Victorian Employers Chamber of Commerce and Industry, welcomed the suggestion of conducting a gap analysis and hoped that the Mission would benefit from the interaction.

## An informal discussion on the Industrial Scenario situation in the Country, Bangalore

November 9, 2009
In the light of the worsening IR situation in the country, specifically with respect to labour unrest, ACMA (Southern Region - Karnataka and Hosur) had an informal discussion on the subject. The meeting was chaired by Mr. K G Mohan Kumar, Zonal Coordinator, Karnataka and Hosur, along with Mr. F R Singhvi, Chairman, HR Sub Committee. This was mainly to share experiences and ideas and look at what could be done to minimise such occurrences. The discussion covered a wide spectrum right from the Pricol incident at Coimbatore to the recent disturbances in the Gurgaon-Manesar belt. Members shared their best practices in order to deal with this issue. A number of ideas came up as an outcome of the discussion. It was suggested that ACMA as a unit pushes for labour reforms. It was opined that the member companies should ensure that their subcontractors, vendors and others complied with labour laws, with special reference to minimum wages, safety and health matters.

## Interaction of ACMA President \& Vice President with Members in the Southern Region, Chennai \& Bangalore November 19, 2009

Southern Region members interacted with ACMA's President Mr. Jayant Davar and Vice President Mr. Srivats Ram. Coinciding with


the interaction, a session was also organised with the Principal Secretary Industries, Mr. M.F. Farooqui and Principal Secretary-Commerce \& Industries Mr. V. P. Baligar of Tamil Nadu and Karnataka respectively.

Baligar mentioned that the Government was keen to give a boost to the manufacturing sector and the automotive industry in particular. Mr. Baligar welcomed the suggestion of continuous dialogue with the industry by way of Joint Working Committees and mentioned that his office would be glad to work with the auto component industry to make the state investment friendly. He also urged the MSME sector in particular to derive benefits from the Quality and Technology Development fund provided by the State Government to update their organisations on aspects of quality and technology.
