	(f) Any company/firm/society/ association registered in India, which is not already a member of ACMA, but wishes to participate in any event including Seminar, Conferences, Workshops, BSM, RBSM, Cluster Project, Training Programs and Exhibitions etc., will have to become Transitory Member for a period of three months from the date of the event.

## Article 2(ii) describe the rights and privileges of membership

The rights and privileges of membership may, in the case of a firm elected in their conventional name as a member of the Association, be exercised by any partner in such firm or by such person authorised by power of attorney or letter of procuration or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee to sign the name of the firm or to sign such names per procuration and may in the case of a joint stock company or other corporation elected in their corporate name as a member of the Association, be exercised by a Director, Manager, Secretary or any other responsible officer of the company or corporation or a person authorised by power of attorney to exercise the same or any other person who in the opinion of the Executive Committee is competent to exercise the same on behalf of the company or corporation, subject, nevertheless, to the following reservations, namely :-

- (a) The representatives of a firm, joint-stock company or other corporation entitled to exercise the rights and privileges of membership must have their names registered in the books of the Association in order to exercise the aforesaid rights and privileges.
- (b) For each act of exercising the rights and privileges of membership by a firm, company or other corporation member, only one representative shall vote.
- (c) Associate Members may attend any such meeting of Executive Committee to which they may be invited or any ordinary or special meeting of the Association and may take part in the discussion but shall not have a right to vote at such meeting/s nor shall have any right to be elected to the Executive Committee of the Association.
- (d) Affiliate Members shall have the right to participate in the Seminars, Workshops, Conventions, Meetings and other similar programs of the Association but shall neither have right to vote at any meeting of the Association or any of its Committees nor shall have any right to be elected to the Executive Committee of the Association.

## Article 2(ii) describe the rights and privileges of membership

  - (d) Affiliate and **Transitory** Members shall have the right to participate in the Seminars, Workshops, Conventions, Meetings and other similar programs of the Association but shall neither have right to vote at any meeting of the Association or any of its Committees nor shall have any right to be elected to the Executive Committee of the Association.
