# B. Bank Resolution

## **Opening of Bank Account in ICICI Bank**

Committee was informed that the MOHI has made amendments in disbursement of Govt. Grants under DCAAI Schemes to nodal agencies. So far, the Ministry shall be remitting the grants to the designated central Nodal Agency and the nodal agency have to open a CNA account in a scheduled commercial bank authorized to conduct Govt. Business by the nodal agency.

Now the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure) has revised the procedure for flow of funds under the Central Sector Schemes. As per the revised procedure *National Automotive Board* has been designated as the Central Nodal Agency for the DCAAI Scheme, who is required to open a Central Nodal Account (CNA) and accordingly, all Implementing Agencies viz., Promote R&D Projects in Automobile & Allied Industry, will function as Sub-Agencies (SA) and open zero balance SA Bank Accounts linked to Central Nodal Agency Account in same bank in which the CNA Account has been opened by National Automotive Board.

National Automotive Board has opened CNA Account with ICICI Bank, Green Park, New Delhi branch. Therefore, ACMA being part of registered Sub Agencies under DCAAI Scheme of GOI, is required to open Zero Balance Account in ICICI Bank, Green Park Branch, New Delhi branch for receiving Govt. Grants under DCAAI Scheme.

With the above background the following resolution needs to be passed to open a Bank Account with ICICI Bank, Green Park, New Delhi Branch:
