

### ACMA ACMA HERO SUPPLIER EXCELLENCE PROGRAM - 2

Skilling and Mentoring (S&M) is an important pillar at Automotive Components Manufacturers Association (ACMA) and is actively engaged in the upgradation of ACMA members through various programs - Cluster interventions, Training programs and Supplier Development Programs through OEMs & large Tier - 1 companies.

One such Supplier Development Program which ACMA S&M is running successfully is ACMA Hero Supplier Excellence Program. ACMA HSEP - 2 consists of 22 companies divided into 3 clusters - Haridwar (7 companies), Ludhiana (7 companies) and Delhi - NCR (8 companies).

### The main topics included in the roadmap are:

- Creating Clean company by 1S & 2S activity and waste removal throughout the plants, to establish a visual factory.
- Employee involvement in all improvement activities namely suggestion schemes, Quality Circles, Kaizens and Safety drives.
- Quality improvement by setting standards of incoming materials, process parameters, and PDI. Recording and analysing customer complaints and also setting standards for internal audits and vendor audits.
- Production planning and control as per customer schedule, regular production monitoring and analysing the variance in hourly production.
- Delivery improvement by introduction of preventive maintenance, die tools maintenance and SMED.
- Holding gains by periodic audits and monitoring PQCDSM parameters on regular basis.

The ACMA team that took charge under guidance of Head Cluster Program, Mr. V K Sharma comprises Mr. Sushil Sharma as Mentor along with the three counselors - Mr. Dinesh Rana (Haridwar), Mr. D K Sharma (Ludhiana) and Mr. Mahavir Singh (Delhi NCR). This team holds a cumulative automotive industry experience of more than 125 years, for transforming the supplier companies.
