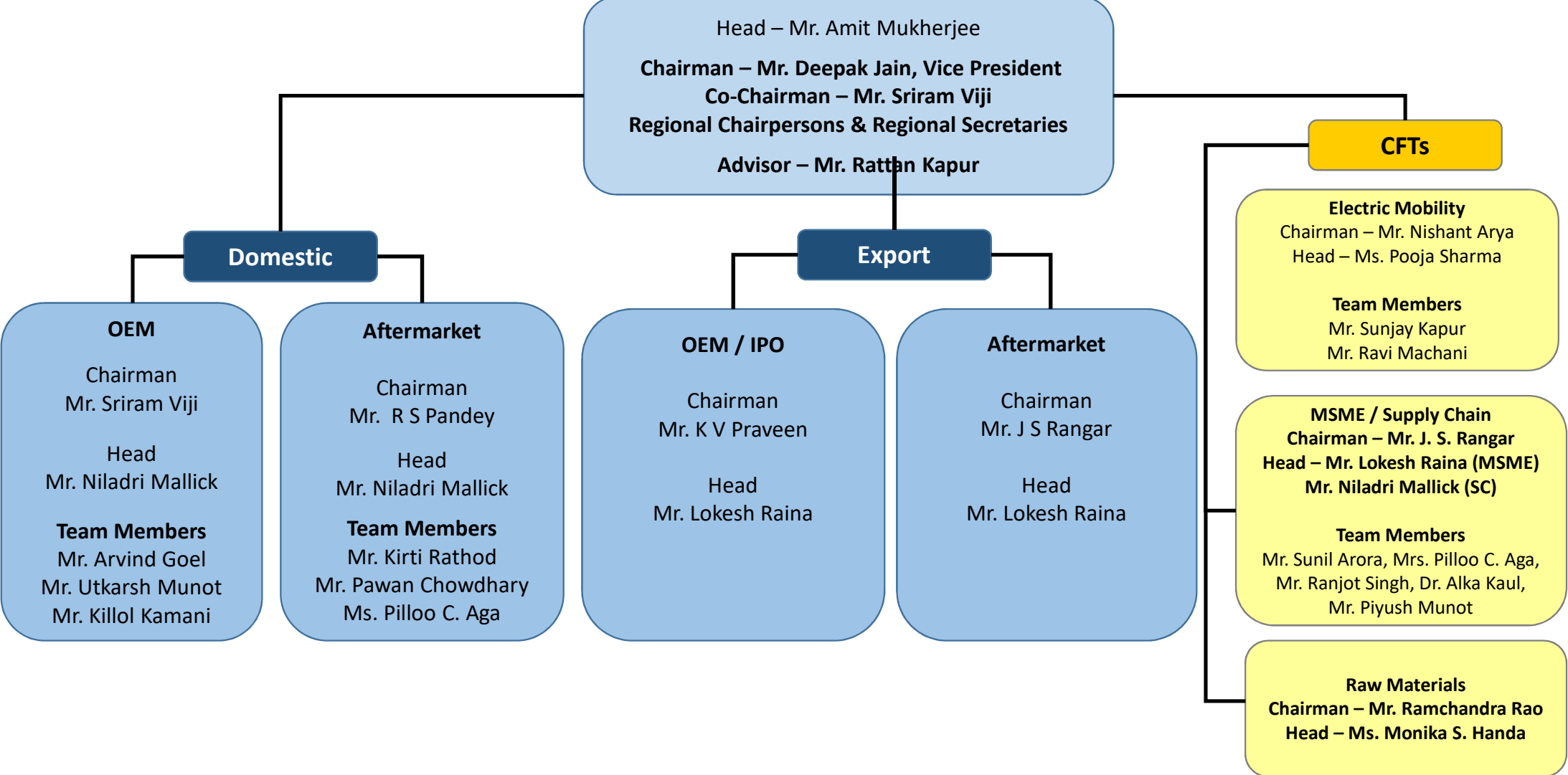

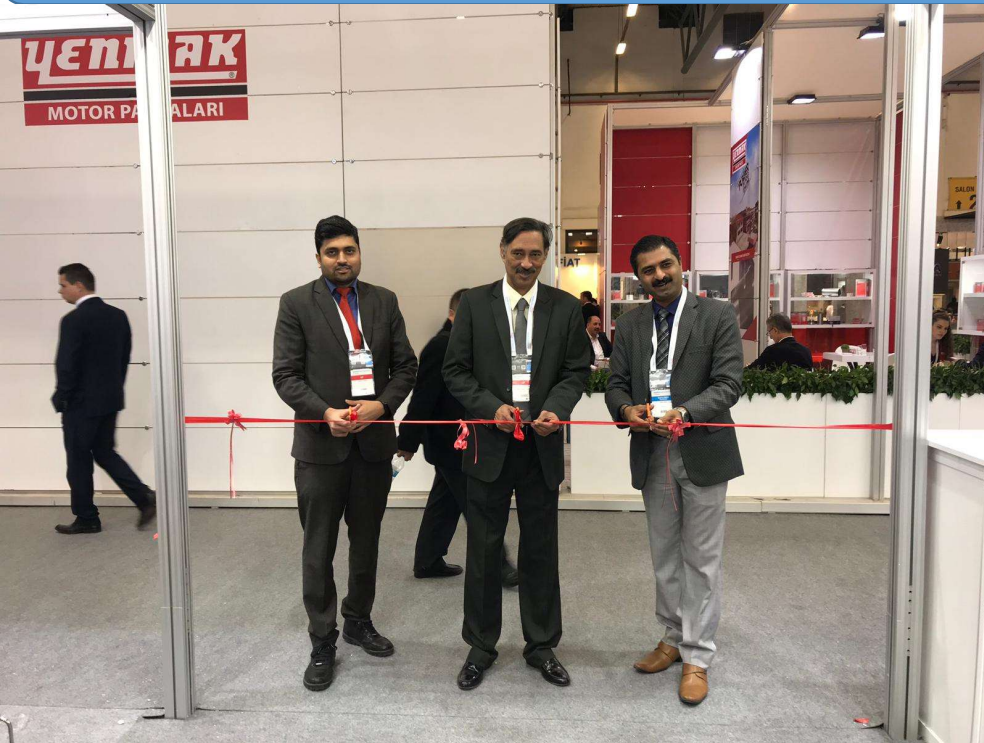

Key conclusions

To curtail Emissions, increase fuel efficiency in IC Engines and Range in Electric Vehicles, OEMs are increasing looking at Light Weight solutions

LW could be introduced in BIW to start with, followed by focus on Chassis and Powertrain
However, during light weighting, Crash safety regulations cannot be compromised

To introduce Light Weight solutions, OEMs, Component Manufactures and Material suppliers need to work in collaboration from the concept and design stage of vehicles

Light weighting is combination of introducing alternative materials - Material Substitution, Material combination, New Joining Techniques, Downsizing and optimisation of design process

Every Material - AHSS, UHSS, Carbon Composites, Engineered plastics, Aluminium, Steel alloys, Magnesium etc. comes with varying benefits and challenges. Economics, Ease of Manufacturing and Environment are key elements to be considered while deliberating on LW

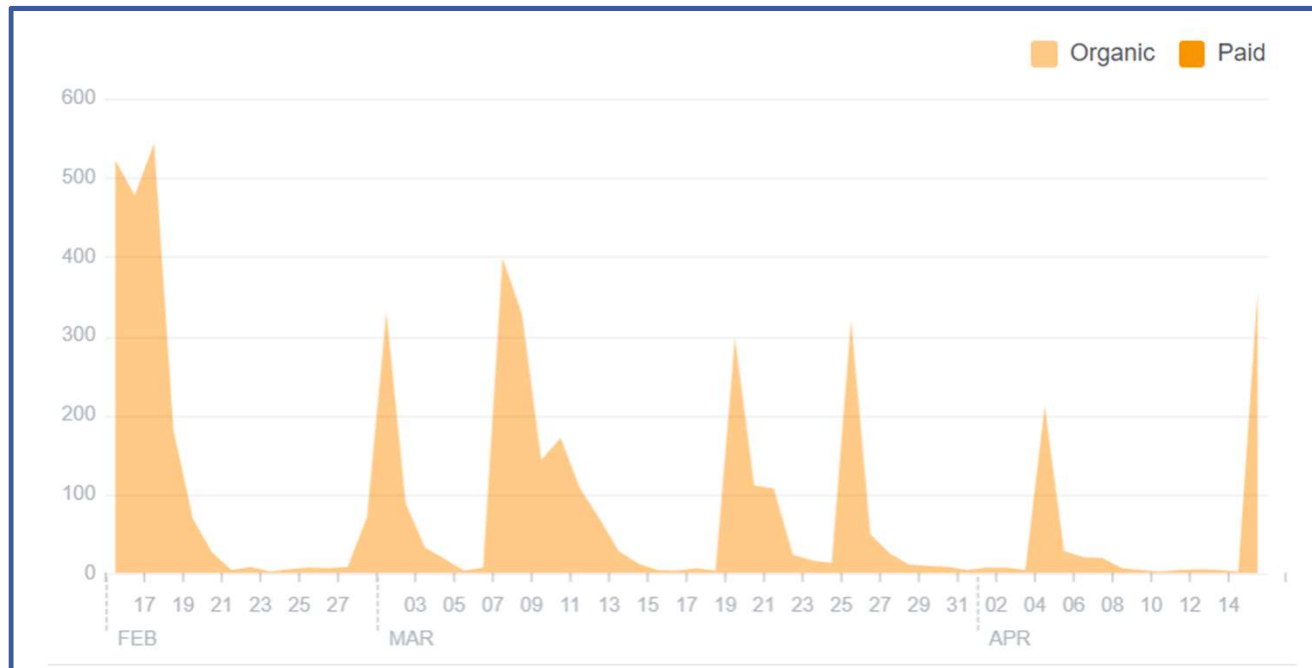

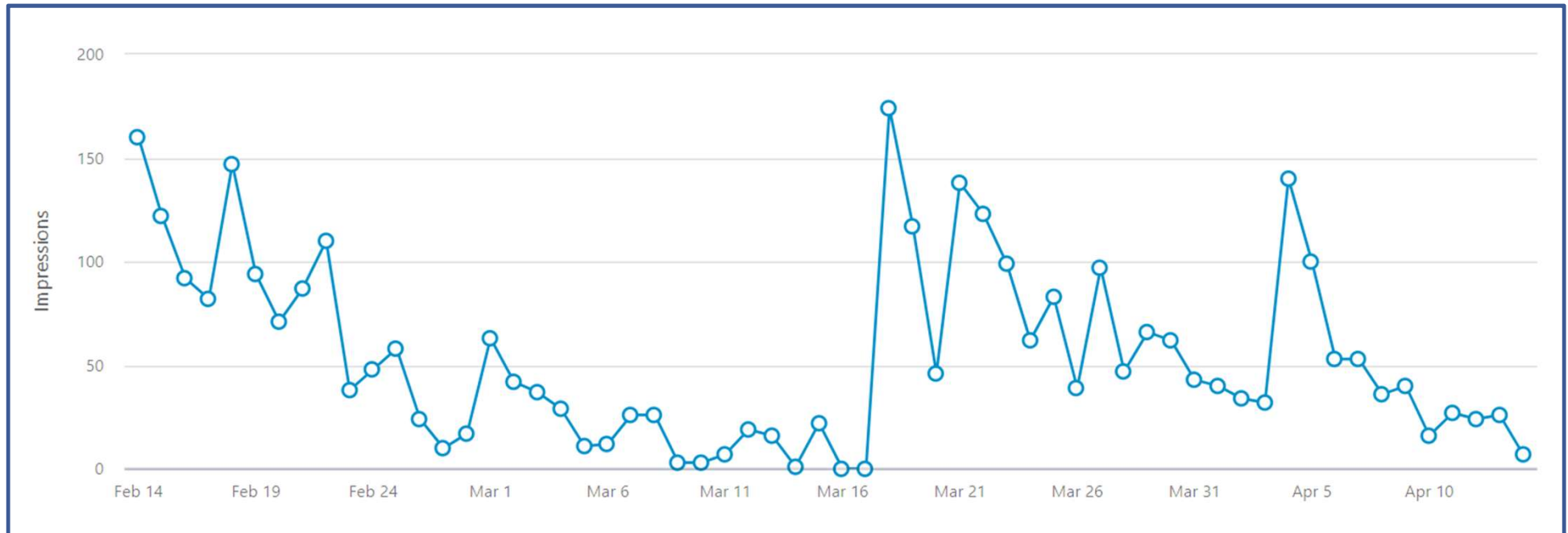
