Minutes of 6th and Last Meeting of ACMA Executive Committee Held on 26th July 2019; Gujarat University Convention and Exhibition Centre, **Ahmedabad**

Mr Ram Venkataramani, President, ACMA welcomed all members of the ACMA Executive Committee. And thanked them for joining the Last Executive Committee meeting (2019-20).

Mr Venkataramani then commenced the meeting.

1.	Confirmation of last EC Meeting Minutes	
	Committee approved the minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee held on 03 rd May 2019 at New Delhi.	
2.	Briefing on discussions/decisions of STC Meeting	
	A. Membership Survey: Finalisation of Consultant	
	President briefed the EC that regarding the ACMA Membership Survey proposals were received from EY, GT, F&S, Markit Excel and PwC, out of which EY and GT were shortlisted. Thereafter, both the agencies made a presentation to the President, ACMA. Presentation by EY was more strategic in nature while that of GT tactical.	
	EY had quoted Rs 40 lakhs while GT had quoted Rs 30 lakhs.	
	It being a downturn year, the STC had opined that the quotes appeared to be on a higher side. Committee members suggested to integrate into the scope inputs from the earlier ACT Survey as also re- negotiate with the consultants for a better quote.	
	B. Study on Financial Ratios across ACMA Membership	
	Considering the need for a better understanding of the financials of the industry, the STC has approved the shortlisting of Markit Excel for conducting such a study.	
	The proposed cost for conducting the study would be Rs. 7 lakh.	
	The agency would collect financial returns/records of ACMA Member companies from the Department of Company Affairs for analysis. Currently, PwC conducts a similar study for ACMA but only for listed companies, which is limited to around 70 companies.	
	C. Appointment of Subject Matter Expert (SME) for Pillar 2 on Government Advocacy, Regulations & Research.	
	EC was briefed that based on the recommendations of the ACMA PPC, the STC had approved the appointment of Mr K K Jalan, Ex Secretary, Department of MSME as a Subject Matter Expert to assit the ACMA secretarit in	

policy and regulatory matters. The assignment for a year would cost Rs. 1.5 lakhs per month. D. ACMA Automechanika India Agreement ACMA had engaged PwC to advise it on what could be the nature of ACMA's engagement/contract with Messe Frankfurt India (MFI) as it was due for a renewal. PWC has advised that AOP is not a good option as it has several legal bindings and significant compliance cost. The existing arrangement that allows ACMA a percentage of profit was most appropriate for organising the future editions of Automechanika New Delhi jointly with MFI. However, PWC would be suggesting modifications to the existing contact to make it more effective for ACMA. The revised agreement will be shared with MFI for their views, which would be effective for next five editions of ACMA Automechanika India Show i.e. for next 10 years. 3. To make a presentation on outcomes of Union Budget, ACMA Executive Committee welcomed Team from Ernst & Young The consultants mentioned that the budget did not have any specific provision for the automotive sector. The budget announcement focused on development of rural as well as urban economy, manufacturing, infrastructure, education & skilling, ease of doing business and attracting investments and encouraging life. innovation and digitization. To promote EVs. Govt. announced Reduction of GST from 12% to 5% and additional Income Tax deduction of Rs. 1.5 lakh on interest paid on loans for purchase of EVs. Import Duty on select Auto Components was also raised to 15%. The Budget also extended 25% corporate tax to companies with turnover of up to Rs. 400 crore, this would

help a large number of Auto Component Manufacturers.

4. **State of Industry:**

To make a presentation on the vehicle industry trends and quarterly projections, ACMA Executive Committee welcomed Mr. Hemal Thakkar, Associate Director, CRISIL.

The key trends observed in various vehicle segments are as under

Two Wheelers:

- Near term drivers not in favour of a robust growth in FY20.
- Increasing penetration of credit bureau and competition among financiers to boost LTV ratios.
- Regulation timeline and Price Impact.
- Utilisation rates to rise in fiscal 2020.
- Two-Wheeler Exports:
 - Asia 40%
 - Africa 35%
 - South America 10%
 - North America 9%
 - Middle East 5%
 - European Union 1%
- HMSI / TVS expand their share, with Bajaj maintaining its clear lead.
- Domestic Sales of Motorcycles recorded a growth of 8% in fiscal 2019 despite higher insurance cost, liquidity constraints and fuel price hike.
- Domestic Sales of Scooters registered a degrowth in fiscal 2019 by 0.27% due to lower sales in rural areas.
- Domestic Sales of Mopeds expected to de-grow in the range 10-12%.

Passenger Cars:

- Fuel prices have turned adverse as compared to last year
- Industry banking on new Model launches amidst increase in oil prices in the short term.
- Cost of ownership to rise; Rising fuel efficiency to reduce the effect.
- Better income prospects and paced development expected to help better demand.
- Interest Rates, Loan-to-value to remain stable.
- Regulations shaping Passenger vehicle industry in India.
- Poor sales in H2 FY19 has dampened utilisation
- Passenger Vehicle Exports:

- -North America 39%
- Africa 20%
- Middle East 12%
- South America 10%
- European Union 10%
- Asia 8%
- Oceanic 1%
- Global firms focused on exports while Maruti, Hyundai are eying domestic market.
- Domestic Sales of Car segment to witness a degrowth in fiscal 2020.
- Domestic Sales of UV and Vans to fall

Commercial Vehicles:

- Freight demand outlook negative in FY20
- Freight rates on a downward trend due to falling diesel price.
- Regulations shaping commercial vehicle industry in
- Higher Capacity Utilization to help improve margins.
- CV Financing industry hits road to recovery, to show robust growth in medium term.
- Commercial Vehicle Exports:
 - Asia 69%
 - Africa 17%
 - Europe 4%
 - Middle East 3%
 - North America 3%
 - South America 3%
 - Others 1%
- Domestic Sales of LCV <3.5T is expected to degrow on a high base of last three years.
- Domestic Sales of LCV 3.5 to 7.5T expects growth to decline in fiscal 2020 by 6-8% on account of lower cash availability with transporter leading to postponement of purchase.
- Domestic Sales of MHCV >7.5T Demand to improve in H2 from bulk commodity.
- Domestic Sales of Buses in fiscal 2020 to be driven by schools. STU demand will see marginal growth and Tourism will support in fiscal 2020.

Tractors:

- Unfavourable demand indicators to lead to degrowth in FY20.
- Actual Agri credit disbursal higher than target in last five years.
- Higher irrigation intensity will boost usage of higher **HP Tractors**
- 41-50 HP segment continued to maintain dominant

- Capacity additions by players and moderate growth in tractor production will lead to decline in capacity utilisation to 70-72% levels in fiscal 2020.
- Tractor Exports:
 - Asia 30%
 - Africa 27%
 - North America 25%
 - European Union 15%
 - North America 3%
- Tractor exports to grow at a moderate 6-8%in fiscal
- Deficient rainfall, low reservoir levels, high inventory levels and weak commercial demand to lower demand in FY20.

Three Wheelers:

- Private Consumption on an Uptrend
- OEMs launching new products will be key driver for future demand
- Growth in disbursements shows promising picture for three-wheeler industry.
- Three-Wheeler Exports:
 - Africa 59%
 - Asia 24%
 - Middle East 6%
 - South America 6%
 - North America 4%
- Export grown at a CAGR of ~10% from FY 14 to **FY19**
- Domestic Sales of Three-Wheeler Passenger saw growth in FY 2018 & FY 2019 due to opening of permits in newer states.
- Domestic Sales in FY 2020 to witness a degrowth since no newer permits are expected.
- Domestic Sales of Three-Wheeler Goods are preferred in rural areas to transport goods due to lack of infrastructure.
- Domestic Sales of Three-Wheeler Goods shift to SCV is expected to slowdown.

- EV Localisation Conference and Exhibition was held on 15 May, 2019, New Delhi. 40 companies participated as exhibitors. The event was inaugurated by Secretary, DHI. and it witnessed interactions with 13 prominent OEMs and participation of 450 delegates.
- 1st Buyers Sellers Meet was held on 3-4 June, 2019. Chennai. The event witnessed participation from 50 companies in 47 stalls and over 200 visitors including leading 11 Global OEMs.
- 1st Automotive Raw Material Conclave & Exhibition was held on 2 July, 2019, New Delhi. 12 companies participated as exhibitors. And it witnessed interactions with 6 prominent OEMs and participation of 150 delegates.
